

PFCC Announces Plan to save Essex PCSOs after additional funding

On Friday 31st January, the Government announced £100m of extra funding for policing nationally. Essex Police's share of this funding, £2.3 million, along with other measures will help bridge the £5.3m shortfall. This is thanks to intervention and lobbying of the Government by Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner Roger Hirst and Essex MPs and Councillors, the Essex Police, Fire and Crime Panel.

On behalf of the EALC, our Chair, Mike Eldred has released the below statement-

'I am delighted to share the news resulting in the retention of all the Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) in Essex. This has come about following intense government lobbying by Roger Hirst, Essex Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner's (PFCC) which has resulted in a last minute increase in government funding to help underpin the policing budget for 2025/26. This outcome is not only a testament to the remarkable work that PCSOs undertake but also highlights the significant role they play within our town and parish communities.

The PFCC's recognition of the invaluable contribution made by PCSOs is a clear indication of the positive impact they have on the safety and well-being of our local areas. Their continued presence will undoubtedly strengthen community ties

and enhance public confidence in our policing efforts. This development serves as a well-deserved acknowledgment of the dedication and commitment shown by our PCSOs in serving the community.'

SCRAP Fly Tipping Campaign

Essex County Council have launched the "SCRAP Fly tipping" campaign, supported by the Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner (PFCC), Essex Police, and the Environment Agency.

The campaign is a joint communications effort to change behaviour through raising awareness of responsible waste disposal and reuse options, alongside increasing the visibility of enforcement actions. The goal is to reduce fly-tipping

incidents, educate residents and boost enforcement against offenders. The SCRAP Fly tipping campaign is part of a wider pilot project including knowledge-sharing and partnership work, to test and learn what interventions can help tackle fly-tipping in Essex.
