### **COUNCILLOR CO-OPTION**

There are currently two councillor vacancies on the Council in the Elms and St Clements Wards. An election trigger notice was received for the Elms Ward vacancy and this will go to election later in the year.

However, the time limit has passed for electors in the St Clements ward to call an election and the vacancy will now be filled by co-option at a Council meeting in March.

The co-opted Councillor will serve until the next ordinary election in May 2023. There are minimal requirements for being a councillor, the main ones are that the person is over 18, lives or works locally and is a UK resident. Full details of eligibility and what it means to become a councillor can be found at leighonseatowncouncil.gov.uk/council-vacancies.

Anyone who is interested is invited to apply via letter or email to the Town Clerk. In the application, please identify any particular interests, qualifications or relevant experience and confirm that you meet the criteria for eligibility and are not disqualified to be a member of the Council.

The closing date for applications is Sunday 28th February, candidates are asked to attend a virtual meeting of Council by Zoom on Tuesday 23rd March at 7.30pm where the co-option procedure will be on the agenda.

# **ROCK PAINTING FUN**

Leigh-on-Sea Town Council have been encouraging the younger residents of the town to help spread a little cheer by leaving painted stones outside the community centre. The Council was inspired by similar local projects and thought it would be a great way to boost community spirit.

The idea is simple, children are able to collect a stone from our basket outside the community centre doors, take it home to decorate and then bring it back to be left on our wall.

The project was launched during last week's half-term, but we will be rolling out during each of the school holidays this year. There will be approximately 60 stones available for each half-term, but you are welcome to use your own stones as well.

#### CHAIRMAN'S CHARITY 2020/21

Cllr Paul Gilson was elected as Town Council Chairman on 18th August 2020. His chosen charity to support during his chairmanship is The Endeavour Trust.

The Endeavour Trust is a charitable organisation set up in 2001 in order to restore and maintain a historic fishing boat from Leigh-on-Sea to its former glory. Endeavour is one of only two surviving Leigh-built fishing boats that went to Dunkirk and is registered with the Association of Dunkirk Little Ships. The charity focuses on the restoration and maintenance of the ship as well as providing educational talks and trips for schools and groups. The Council already has an alliance with this charity, supporting it over many years through the Council's Grant Aid Award Scheme.

Information from the digital-first census will help decide how services are planned and funded in your local area. This could mean things like doctors' surgeries, housing or new bus routes.

Households will receive a letter with a unique access code in the post, allowing them to complete their questionnaire online. Paper questionnaires will be available on request. Census day is March 21.

#### **GRANT AWARD SCHEME**

Applications are now being accepted for our Grant Award Scheme. The Council offer grants of up to £500 for charitable, not-for-profit organisations and community initiatives throughout the town.

The grant can also be awarded in the form of a bursary to cover the cost of room hire at Leigh Community Centre. This is ideal for organisations who need an accessible space to run events, workshops or meetings that will benefit the local community.

Multiple bursaries can be awarded at each intake, with the next deadline for applications being Wednesday 31st March 2021.

#### **KEEPING IN TOUCH MAGAZINE**

In November, we launched our Keeping in Touch magazine a mini publication which goes to our Community Transport members every 4 weeks. As most of our members don't have internet access it allows them to stay updated with council and community news, gives ideas for things to do at home, advice and local helplines. The magazine has been incredibly well received by our members, and so have decided to continue this initative beyond COVID.
