The Council would like to thank them for their time and service over the last four years. The new administration welcomes new councillors Alan Hart who stood unopposed in St. James' Ward, and Mike Wells and Douglas Cracknell

# **COMMUNITY CENTRE** REFURBISHMENT

The remodel of the Community Centre is now well underway. The last 6 months has seen a replacement lift installed, essential roof repairs undertaken and the restoration of the Lantern Light. The next phase of the refurbishment includes replacement windows in Room 1, the remodelling of public and office areas, including a refurbishment of the ground floor toilets. Works will be delivered with minimal disruption to hirers and centre users.


