NEW CHAIRMAN

We are pleased to announce Cllr Keith Evans was elected as Council Chairman at our recent Annual Council Meeting on Tuesday 24th May for 2022 - 2023. He will be joined by Cllr Dr. David Bowry as Vice-Chairman for the administrative year.

CHAIRMAN'S CHARITY

Our retiring Council Chairman Doug Cracknell, spent the 2021/2022 Council Year raising funds for his nominated charity Southend Phab, who run the Phabulous Café on Leigh Road, supporting adults with disabilities to get work experience. Cllr Cracknell raised a grand total of £1000 by taking part in the Leigh bric-a-brac trail and selling handmade cards at our Farmers' Market. Funds were also raised at town events over the year including our monthly poetry night.

Our new Chairman Cllr Keith Evans has selected Gold Geese as his charity for the upcoming year, and will be holding events and initiatives over the next year to raise funds to support the work they do to look after families affected by childhood cancer. We then held our family-friendly community picnic in Bonchurch Park on Sunday 29th May, with a variety of live musical performances from Below Sea Level, The Hoy Shanty Crew, Kristine Boicuka, The Show Choir and Tim Howar from Mike and the Mechanics. We were also joined by the Art Ministry, Love on the Rocks UK, Magic Dave and Kerry Doyland who offered free crafts and activities for children, as well as a variety of community stalls. Despite the weather being a bit wet at times we had a fantastic crowd who joined in with a rousing sing-along of Land of Hope and Glory and the National Anthem. We are so grateful to our wonderful community for volunteering their time whether to entertain us all, provide activities or just to showcase their organisations.

At Leigh Community Centre on Tuesday 31st May, we ran a free arts and crafts event for children thanks to the Art Ministry. Our Over 60's Social Club came back with a bang in September 2021 after being on hiatus due to the pandemic. Since then, we have had the privilege to supply meals, entertainment and company for up to 40 older adults twice a month. Lorna & Lottie's Café at the Centre provide a delicious lunch, and staff schedule in a variety of talks and activities. Admittance is £5 including lunch, £2 if not eating with us - you are welcome to bring your own lunch - unlimited hot drinks and biscuits are also available. Please book in advance by calling 01702 716288 to order your lunch, those arriving on the day who haven't booked, may not be served food. All dietary requirements can be catered for.

The club runs on the first and third Wednesday of the month from I2pm - I.30pm at Leigh Community Centre. Anyone is welcome to come along to the club, however we cannot provide transport or respite care.
